• The main entrance has level access to the upper level of the Great Hall, with a ramp to the lower level. The ramp is permanent. 

Travel by public transport

- You can get to Oakham Castle by bus and train.
- There is a bus stop a short walk from Oakham Castle on the High Street. The bus stop is 0.1 miles / 0.1 km from Oakham Castle.
- The nearest train station is Oakham. The train station is 0.6 miles / 1.0 km from Oakham Castle.
- Oakham Castle is a 10-minute walk from Oakham Railway Station, a distance of half a mile.

Parking

- Free parking is permitted adjacent to the Great Hall in the castle grounds on collection of a permit from the reception desk or café.
- From the car park to the entrance, there is level access.
- The route is 1600mm wide, or more.



Arrival

Main entrance

- The main entrance has level access.
- The automatic doors are 1000mm wide.








Getting around inside



• There are no staircases in Oakham Castle. There is one step leading to the café, or access is available via the ramp. There is one step leading to the cells, which are not accessible for wheelchair users.





Ticket/information desk

Reception Counter

From the main entrance to the desk there is level access.



Public Toilets

- There are two public toilets for disabled visitors.
- From the main entrance to the disabled public toilet there is access via a permanent ramp leading through the café and into the toilet block.
- It is also possible to gain access to the toilet block via a level path round the side of the building.



- The route is 830mm wide, or more.
- The toilet doors are 1006mm wide.



- The disabled toilet door is 860mm.
- The toilet seat is 500mm high. The toilets have handrails.



Castle Shop

• From the main entrance to the shop there is level access.



Getting around outside





Outside a smooth, level path wide enough for wheelchairs runs around most of the building. This allows a good view of the rest of the site, which is not accessible in a wheelchair due to the very sloping nature of the ground.

• The route is 300mm wide, or more.
